

AMS ACTA Mission Statement and Repository Policies

Content

1. This is the institutional repository dedicated to research output of the University of Bologna. 2. AMS Acta will accept any material that relates to research output of the University of Bologna, including research data, in any format. Examples of material include journal articles, monograph series, books, book chapters, conference papers, working papers, data sets and unpublished research. 3. Research papers may include: (a) unpublished pre-prints (not peer-reviewed), (b) final peer-reviewed drafts (post-prints), (c) published versions. 4. Research papers are individually tagged with their peer-review and publication status. 5. Principal Language: Italian

Submission Policy

1. The aim of AMS Acta is to provide a permanent record of the research output of the University of Bologna and maximize the visibility, usage and impact of this research through global access. 2. The repository will include an author deposited copy of the research paper/work/dataset or a deposit made by a second party authorised by the author. 3. Where possible the repository will provide immediate open access to research items with the option of an embargo period to delay public visibility to meet funders and publishers requirements. 4. All deposits will be assessed to ensure that they are within the scope of the repository by administrative staff although responsibility for the deposits and the content of the research works lies with the author. The author is thus to be held responsible for the contents of texts, data sets, materials and works, including the ownership and legitimacy of usage of texts, images, pictures, data and any other contents.

Metadata Policy

1. Anyone may access the metadata free of charge. 2. The metadata may be re-used in any medium without prior permission for not-for-profit purposes and re-sold commercially provided the OAI Identifier or a link to the original metadata record are given.

Data Policy

1. Items are available free of charge and they can be used accordingly to the licenses visible on the metadata page. The repository supports the Creative Commons Licenses and, unless stated otherwise, items can be reproduced, displayed or performed in any format or medium, for personal research or study, educational, or not-for-profit purposes without prior permission or charge, provided that the authors, title, DOI, full bibliographic details and a hyperlink or URL for the original metadata page are given. 2. Full items may be harvested by robots transiently or permanently. 3. Unless stated otherwise, full items must not be sold commercially in any format or medium without formal permission of the copyright holders. 4. At the author's request, items are deposited at the National Central Library of Florence for permanent archiving and long preservation. 5. Items are identified by a unique persistent identifier (DOI) given by the original publisher or by the repository itself.
